Greetings from Childhood Ministries!!

Greetings from Childhood Ministries! Our Extended Care program is now back to normal. We had 18 children and 2 staff members out for over a week, due to being quarantined because one of our School Age children were sent home from school with a fever and headache, and then tested positive for Covid. I worked closely with Tiffin City Schools and the Seneca County Health Department to determine who would need to be quarantined. I came in on a Sunday morning and made all necessary phone calls. It was a tough morning for me, but on a positive note, I came upstairs for the special congregational meeting and was pleased to find out that our security wall was unanimously approved!

Our preschool classes continue to meet in person. We have had a few children absent due to illness and three were quarantined, one unrelated to the previous case. We continue to teach and nurture the children who are here, adapting as we go!

Our Pre Three classes have focused on Fall Harvest, Friendship (Pilgrims and Indians) and Thanksgiving. The children have also been working on the color yellow, triangle shapes and the letter "T". They have been talking about being thankful for friends, family, dinosaurs, pizza and various other things that three year olds are thankful for

Our Pre Four/Five classes have been concentrating on the letters "T"(Turkey Time), "I"(Indians) and "U" (Ugly Duckling). I donned my pilgrim costume and visited Ms. Mindy's classroom and read our traditional Thanksgiving story, as the children feasted on puff corn and fishy crackers! This certainly was not the Thanksgiving Feast that we normally have, but as I said earlier, we have been forced to adapt! It has been a very challenging time for all, as we struggle to clean toys, take

temperatures and play and learn together as we stay socially distanced.

This has been a very difficult year for all of us! The Thanksgiving season reminds me of a phrase I used earlier this year, "We are all in the same storm, but we are not on the same ship!" Much like our many ancestors who came to America, many years ago, our struggles are not all exactly the same, but we are all dealing with many of the same problems. It is not more difficult to be thankful this Thanksgiving, but what we appreciate may be a little different! I am thankful for my family (especially my new grandson and my father, who is celebrating his 86th birthday today), my job, my co-workers and all that make our programs here possible), my friends, food and a warm home to go to at the end of the day!

First Lutheran Church Council Meeting Minutes October 19, 2020

The meeting was called to order by President Rick Greene who declared a quorum. We met via Zoom Meetings due to the Corona virus situation. Participating in the meeting were: Pastor Bailey, Rick Greene, Deb Nominee, Bonnie Oberlander, Kelly Cook, Jane Fruth, Janet Zirger, Anna Widman and Linda Ellinger. Absent were, Amy Mills and Kelly Reis-Kelly. Pastor Bailey led us in prayer.

Agenda: Janet Zirger moved to accept the agenda, seconded by Linda Ellinger. The motion passed.

Minutes: The minutes from the September 2020 meeting were sent previously via email. Bonnie moved to accept the minutes; Deb Nominee seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

Treasurer's Report: Jane presented both August and September's treasurer's report. Linda moved to accept the report and Deb Nominee seconded. The motion passed.

OLD BUSINESS

<u>Pre-School Phase I Door Progress</u> No meeting was held last week as Jane Fredericks had to fill in for an absent teacher. A second quote from Jeff Hohman Design (JHD) has been received for \$9,860. (\$3,410 for the stairwell and \$6,450 for the doors. The only other quote received was from Clouse Construction for \$11,327.

Discussion followed concerning how to hold a congregational meeting during Covid so that we can proceed with the project. Pastor will add information concerning this to his "Planning for the week ahead" weekly email. The congregation will be notified by post card two weeks prior to the meeting. Kelly Cook moved to proceed with the project, Bonnie seconded, and the motion passed. Jane moved to hold the congregational meeting on November 8th. Anna seconded and the motion passed.

NEW BUSINESS

<u>Spectrum/At&T</u> Wifi and internet issues prompted a review of the provider. Spectrum offers a much higher download and upload than AT&T (our current provider) at a \$20 savings per month locked in for two years. Linda moved to change our provider to Spectrum, Janet seconded, and the motion passed.

<u>**UIS Insurance Premium**</u> The proposal for next year shows no increase in premium.

maintenance projects in our future (air conditioning, fellowship hall roof, house roof, etc.) it was suggested that a list be made and prioritized so that we can begin to raise the funds necessary to complete the projects.

Pastor's Salary Pastor is currently at Level 16. Executive council proposed that he be moved to Level 19 while reducing his insurance coverage from the gold Plus to the Silver Plus. Special Congregational Meeting November 8, 2020

Congregational Meeting

November 8, 2020

The purpose of this meeting was to discuss and vote on the first phase of security needed for the protection and well being of our Preschool.

President Rick Greene called the meeting to order. He announced that we had a quorum of members and the meeting could continue.

Using a diagram, President Rick Greene explained the issue to be voted upon. Phase 1 is to install a wall with a new door made of oak wood and glass to compliment the existing woodwork. That being done it would be necessary to reverse the direction of the stairwell door to limit access to the basement. We have secured two estimates:

One estimate is from Clouse Construction for \$11,324.

A second estimate is from Jeff Hohman Design for \$9,860.

At this time Council has not made a decision on which company to hire.

The vote today is to approve the construction for this project and that it not exceed \$13,000.

Due to Covid-19, a voting system used by Synod, was used at the meeting. Each member received three cards, red, green, white. Raising the white card signaled that you had a question. Raising the red card signified that you wanted to vote "no" while raising the green card signified a "yes" vote.

President Rick Greene asked if there were questions about this project. Since there were no questions, he asked for a motion to approve the Phase 1 of this project and its funding. A motion was made by Mike Porter to approve the project. It was seconded by John Swope. All in favor raised they green card. Those opposed raised their red card. The vote was unanimous to approve the project.

President Rick Greene then asked for a motion to adjourn the meeting. A motion to adjourn was made by Shelley Ross and seconded by Melissa Chester.
